Cermak Eisenkraft Gallery returns to the prestigious Art Paris 2024

Prague, Paris, 2 April 2024 - After six years, Cermak Eisenkraft_ Gallery is exhibiting again at Art Paris, this time at its 26th edition, which will take place from **3 to 7 April 2024** at the Grand Palais Éphémère. 135 modern and contemporary art galleries from 25 countries will be present at this exceptional centre of Parisian art. Cermak Eisenkraft Gallery, historically the only one from the Czech Republic invited to this prestigious event, will exhibit in one of the largest stands of the fair (E8) works by Czech masters such as Toyen, Jindřich Štyrský, Jiří Remo Jelínek, Josef Čapek, Emil Filla, Mikuláš Medek, Josef Šíma, Karel Černý, Vladimír Škoda and František Kupka. Among the foreign artists, Pablo Picasso, Giorgio de Chirico and Óscar Domínguez will be presented, whose works are in dialogue with the Czech artists mentioned above.

The concept of the entire stand is based not only on the aim of presenting the jewels of Czech visual art across the 20th century, but the presentation at this international forum represents a unique opportunity to promote Czech art on the European scene. The total value of the presented works exceeds five million euros, i.e. more than **127 million crowns**.

The Art Paris VIP Preview will take place on Wednesday 3rd April 2024 and all those interested in art are cordially invited to attend. This year's edition of Art Paris will also be the last to be held at the Grand Palais Éphémère before the Paris Olympics and the reopening of the newly renovated Grand Palais, where Art Paris is traditionally held. It is therefore a unique opportunity to attend a prestigious event in this unique setting.
